Junior Infants Yellow

It is hard to believe that we have done two terms in Junior Infants Yellow. The boys and girls have come on so much since September and it is fantastic seeing their progress. The class have been working so hard at maths and have learned a lot so far. We have started lots of new topics this term and are doing super work. The class have done up to number five and are beginning to learn all the ways to make five. We have looked at weight, length, height and were recently working with money. The boys and girls love playing games in maths.

As a school we had Seachtain na Gaeilge, Water Week and Literacy week. Junior Infants Yellow loved all the activities that went along with these weeks and look forward to lots more fun and learning in term three!

Senior Infants Pink

It has been a very busy second term here in Senior Infants Pink Class! In English, we have all developed good confidence when reading aloud and have become great readers. We have already finished our first class reader called 'The Big Horse'. We have learned all of our new digraph sounds and are going to keep practising them over the next few months. We have also been learning lots of new Dolch words and are getting better at recognising them in our reading every week. In Maths, we have worked really hard and have had lots of fun exploring different ways to do addition using various manipulatives such as cubes, counters, beads and number lines. We also explored the topics of length, weight, capacity and patterns. In SESE, we have learned all about Spring time and the changes that happen to plants and animals in this wonderful season.

In Aistear this term, we have explored two different themes. The first theme we explored was 'The Hospital'. We really enjoyed acting in role as doctors and nurses in the roleplay area and making x-ray crafts in the Art area during this time. The second theme we explored was 'The Garden Centre'. We loved making tulip crafts for this theme using coloured paper and we also really enjoyed making flowers and garden models in the construction area.

Well done to all the boys and girls in Senior Infants Pink Class for all their hard work this term, I am very proud of you all. I hope everyone has a super Spring break and I look forward to seeing everyone back in school in April ready for more learning, fun and adventure!



Senior Infants / First Class Green

A big hello from Senior Infants and First Class Green! This term has been a busy one with Seachtain na Gaeilge, Water Week and Intercultural Fortnight. These past months, we have been working hard on improving and extending our independent writing skills in both classes. Both classes have finished their first reader and are working away on their second reader. We have, also, been working on rhymes and expanding our vocabulary through nursery rhymes, show and tell and drama games. We have really enjoyed this work in English and we are looking forward to exploring new books and genres next term.

In Maths, we have become number-line and addition masters. We have explored loads of other Maths topics in both classes including problem-solving, data, place value, money, number work and shapes. We love doing Gaeilge lessons every morning. This term we have covered the topics of Caitheamh Aimsire, Ag Siopadóireacht and An Aimsir. We learned songs and rhymes in Irish and played a variety of games such as Bingo, Cluiche Kim and many more. We have also been doing lots of listening in Gaeilge including watching animations and stories on TG4.

This term we have worked so hard especially in History, Geography and Science. We explored the topics of Brazil, water in our world, the doctor's surgery, the post office, people who help us, the titanic, spring and plants. We really enjoyed this work, especially when we got to use these topics in our Art and Drama work. We created spring collages, lily pads, Brazilian pop art pictures, carnavalesque masks and thank you cards for our families. In Music and Drama, we explored the above topics by creating rainforest and water compositions and retelling stories in drama in different ways. You can see some of these on our website each month.

2nd Class Orange






Rainbow Class
