To demonstrate the importance of community, the Parents' Association are collecting new hats, scarves and gloves to donate to the homeless in Dublin; all donations will be gratefully received.

Staff have shown huge commitment and dedication, and have gone above-and-beyond to provide additional learning experiences to pupils.

Senior Infants Pink

It has been an amazing and very busy first term in Senior Infants Pink Class! In Maths, we have worked really hard and have had lots of fun exploring our number bonds of 5, 6, 7, 8, 9 and 10. We also explored the topic of 2D Shapes, Patterns and Time. In English, we have become great readers and we are trying our best to sound out any new words that we see. We have also been learning lots of new Dolch words and are getting better at recognising them in our reading every week. In Science, we took part in lots of exciting experiments especially during Science Week in November. More recently, we have been learning about Winter. We explored the topic of 'Hibernation' and even made some brown bear crafts using brown paint and paper plates.

In Aistear this term, we have explored three different themes. The first theme we explored was 'The Supermarket'. We really enjoyed playing shop in the roleplay area and making shopping bags in the Art area during this time. The second theme we explored was 'The Post Office'. We loved writing letters and posting them in our very own post box. The last theme we have explored this term is 'The Arctic'. We thoroughly enjoyed this topic and theme. We learned all about arctic animals and what it would be like to live in the Arctic. In the roleplay area, we pretended to be Inuit people and went fishing for food in the Arctic sea. We even had an igloo in the roleplay area too!

Senior Infants and First Class Green

In Term 1, we have had loads of fun learning new exciting topics. This past few months, we have been working hard on improving our reading and writing in Senior Infants and 1st Class. In Senior Infants, we have focused on revising sounds we know and learning new sounds. This has helped us to read harder words in our station work and our books at home. In both classes, we have been working on improving our handwriting and writing skills. Senior Infants have begun to use their phonics knowledge to write sentences independently during our news time and free writing activities. Our first-class pupils have expanded their writing skills through learning new genres, editing, revision of our phonics and new grammar topics. Both classes have done excellent work in our English Aistear station this month, especially in our new favourite game 'Teach My Monster to Read' on the laptops and iPads.

In Maths, both classes have become addition masters focusing on numbers from 0-20. We have also explored loads of other Maths topics this term, between the two classes including: Spatial Relations, 2D Shapes, Length and Time. We love doing Gaeilge lessons every morning and we have become very confident in using different phrases based on food, school and ourselves in class and in our lessons. We love reading Irish stories and listening to the story of the day on Cúla 4.

This term we have worked so hard especially in History, Geography and Science. We learned about the Polar regions of the world, magnets, hibernation, lifecycles of different animals and plants, the people who help us, Ireland long ago and a variety of different stories for sequencing activities. We really enjoyed this work especially when we got to use these topics in our Art, Music and Drama work. We created art from different materials including collage flowers, winter hats, cupcake snowmen, listening and art in chalk and newspaper polar bears. Support Team

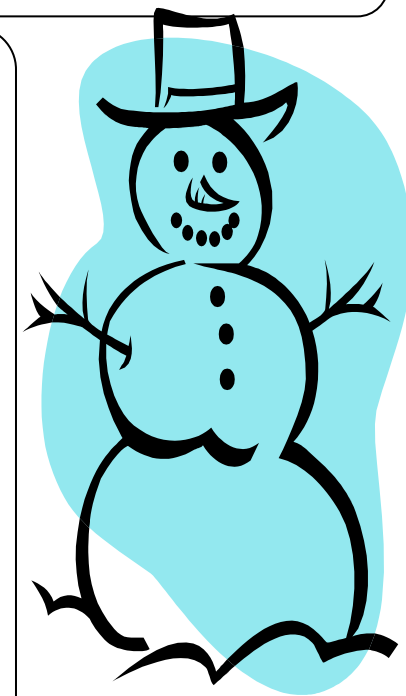
The Support teachers have had a wonderful term and we want to thank all the boys and girls for their hard work and dedication this term.

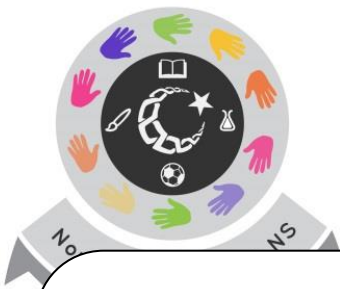

What a busy term it has been in Second Class Orange!

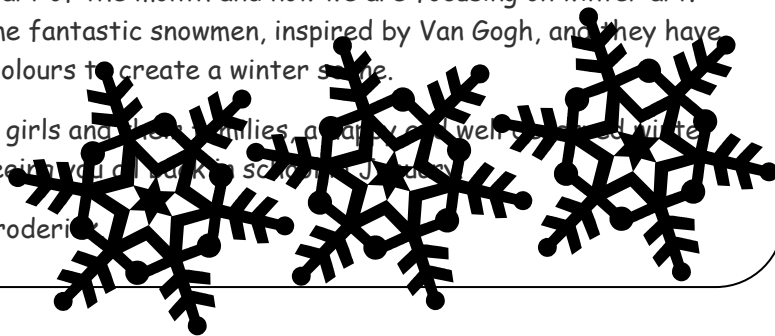

We conducted a number of experiments relating to sound, light, static electricity and more. We were especially busy during science week where we managed to squeeze in four experiments. We then showed the senior infants our findings. We love meeting the senior infants to read to them in the afternoons too. This helps us practise our reading and we are fantastic at bringing the stories to life for our younger partners.

Our art work has sent us home with messy fingers more than once due to clay, slime, paint and glitter. We look forward to our art project each week and the mess is well worth the completed product. We thoroughly enjoy our drama lessons and adore acting out stimulating scenarios together. Music has allowed us to discover lots of new genres which we have creatively added actions and lyrics to.
